Please ensure your child has recess and lunch every day. Hungry children find it extremely hard to concentrate and this is detrimental to their learning – recess is especially important as it refuels children for their learning between recess and lunch and ensures they have the energy to participate effectively in all school activities. Fruit is an excellent recess option.
