LIHIR INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY SCHOOL

SUNSMART POLICY (Version August 11)

Rationale:

Lihir International Primary School realizes the need to protect children's skin and educate them about SunSmart behaviour, thus reducing the risk of skin damage from over exposure to the harmful rays of the sun.

Aims:

The policy aims to:

- Provide ongoing education that promotes personal responsibility for skin cancer prevention
- Provide environments that support SunSmart practices.

Implementation

Lihir International Primary School will:

- Inform parents of the SunSmart policy when they enrol their child.
- Include the SunSmart policy statement in the school guidelines.
- Be conscious of the amount of shade in the school grounds, where possible, by building shelters, shade areas and planting trees.
- Incorporate education programs that focus on skin cancer prevention into the school curriculum.
- Encourage all teachers and staff to act as positive role models for children in all ٠ aspects of SunSmart behaviour.
- Ensure that all students and staff wear hats when outdoors.
- Where students have not got an appropriate hat then there is a designated shaded or covered area for recess and lunch times play periods.
- The "No hat no play" phrase is learnt by Early Years students.
- Encourage students to apply sunscreen provided when they will be exposed to the sun • for extended periods.
- Regularly review the school dress code to ensure uniforms are SunSmart.
- Ensure that adequate shade is provided at sporting carnivals and other outdoor events
- Regularly review the SunSmart policy

Expectations

Parents and staff are expected to:

- Provide an approved SunSmart hat for their child and ensure that they wear it.
- Apply sunscreen before the child comes to school each day.
- Ensure sunscreen is available for the student to apply during school hours.
- Act as positive role models by practicing SunSmart behaviour.
- Support the school's SunSmart policy.

Students are expected to:

- Be aware of the school's SunSmart policy
- Take responsibility for their own health and safety by being SunSmart
- Comply with SunSmart rules and guidelines by wearing suitable hats, clothing, sunscreen.
- Act as positive role models for other students in all aspects of SunSmart behaviour
- Help to design and regularly update the SunSmart policy
- Participate in SunSmart education programs.







LIHIR INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY (Version November 18)

Rationale:

A school's dress code can play an important role in promoting a positive image of the school and creating a sense of identity. Wearing the school uniform is expected of all students.

This includes Senior Kindy students but is optional for Junior Kindy students.

Aims:

- 1. To foster and enhance the public image of the school
- 2. To assist in building school and team spirit and pride
- 3. To encourage equity amongst students
- 4. To assist students to understand that society has dress and safety codes

Implementation

The school uniform consists of the Sports Uniform and Dress Uniform

Dress Uniform

Girls: Uniform dress, school hat, sandals or sports shoes and white socks. Or Uniform dress shirt girls' maroon culottes/skorts or shorts, school hat, and fo

<u>Or</u> Uniform dress shirt, girls' maroon culottes/skorts or shorts, school hat, and footwear as above.

Boys: Uniform dress shirt, maroon shorts, school hat, sandals or sports shoes and white socks.

Sports Uniform

Boys and Girls: Blue or Red house polo shirt, navy blue shorts, school hat, sandshoes and white socks.

Note:

- Dress Uniforms are to be worn on most school days
- Sports Uniforms are worn on the day that is the class PE day
- Uniforms are compulsory and students are encouraged to take pride in themselves and their uniform
- Appropriate footwear is essential and thongs are not permitted
- No T-shirts are to be visible underneath the uniform
- No excessive amounts of jewellery
- No bleached/faded shorts/shirts

Grooming

- Finger nails are to be clean
- Teeth must be brushed
- No make-up (of any kind) is to be worn
- Long hair (shoulder length or longer) is to be tied back
- Hair is to be trimmed neatly. No rasta, rats tails, etc.

Personal Accessories

- One pair of earrings can be worn (studs or sleepers only)
- A watch may be worn
- No bracelets of any kind are to be worn including promotional rubber wrist bands
- No rings are to be worn

The P&W will advise the Principal on any variations to the school uniform.

Uniforms can be purchased from the P&W through the school office and a second hand uniform facility is available.
